Members in Profile

Don Mathieson

My interest in photography began in about 1968, when a friend sold me an old German Camera. (I can't remember the name.) It was 1950's vintage, with a fixed lens, and no special features other than the famous German precision.

Since the settings had to be made manually, I had to do a lot of guessing. But through trial and error, I began to understand the relationship between the aperture and shutter speed, and how they affect the stop action and the depth of field. I also set up a basic black & white darkroom, in the basement.

After a couple of years, I bought a brand new Pentax SLR camera. WOW! What luxury! This camera actually had a built-in light meter, and a focusing screen. After those manual settings, I thought I had died and gone to Heaven.

Back then I shot mostly slides, but I acquired an old Mamiya twin lens reflex that I used for making black & white prints.

As I got more comfortable in the darkroom, I advanced into colour, and joined the Photo Club, in about 1985. I bought a good quality colour enlarger, and started making Cibachrome prints from my slides. Also by now I was using a Nikon camera system.

My interest in photography faded when my company downsized, and in order to stay employed, I had to bump to another location. For a few

years my job as a communication technician caused me to be away from home except for weekends. I sold most of my equipment, and shut down my darkroom, and for several years I didn't renew my Photo Club membership.

Since retiring, I've had the time to devote to my renewed interest in photography, and I rejoined the Photo Club. I've now sold my last remaining film equipment, and have gone totally digital. I upgraded my computer to allow for the installation of the latest versions of Adobe PhotoShop, and I use the Canon system of digital cameras and lenses.

My old darkroom has been converted to a pantry. I sure don't miss mixing of chemicals, adjusting of temperatures, and trying to control dust! Most days, I spend some time in my "digital darkroom", where I enjoy converting my old negatives, and slides into digital images. I also enjoy making abstracts, and montages.

In the past couple of years, I spent a lot of time at Wascana Park, keeping track of the "Big Dig". Even now, after the main job has been completed, you can still find lots of activity, as the workers continue the upgrading of our beautiful park.

These days I stay fit by walking about ten kilometers a day either on my treadmill, or hiking around the lake, or the Devonian Pathway, NEVER WITHOUT MY CAMERA.

PRPA Outing - Nordegg

Ten RPC members attended the annual outing of the June 17th to 19th Prairie Region of Photographic Outing at the Goldeye Centre, Nordegg, Alberta.

Club member, Don Mathieson came away a big winner with a 3rd place in Sport in Action with *Top of His Form*. He won first in the Digital Creative Imagery category with *Marsh Abstract* and 2nd in Digital Extreme Enhancement with *Water Dance*. Don

received the Curtiss Lund Trophy for the highest aggregate score.

Due to extreme rainfall, some tours were cancelled. Several Hours were spent touring the Brazeau Collier historic mine site.

A workshop presented by Frans Bouwers from the Kananaskis School of Photography covered many subjects from use of tripods, composition, depth of field, exposure, outdoor flash and an introduction to photo judging.

SASKATCHEWAN CENTENNIAL WEB PHOTO COMPETITION

Saskatchewan residents are invited to show their centennial spirit by entering the Saskatchewan Government Centennial Web Photo Competition. It's also an opportunity for Saskatchewan shutterbugs to showcase their talent to the world.

Sponsored by the Information Technology Office, the competition is open to all Saskatchewan residents, 16 years of age or older. There is no entry fee required to participate.

"This is another fun way for Saskatchewan people to help celebrate the centennial, as they explore our province and its communities looking for good photographic subjects", Information Technology Minister Andrew Thomson said. "The photos they take will also create a lasting pictorial of our beautiful and diverse province for all to see and enjoy."

Photos can be submitted in any subject area that highlights an aspect of Saskatchewan. Suggested themes include nature/landscape, city/

townscape, recreation and culture. Entries will be judged on quality and content.

The grand prize winner will receive a media P.C. package, second place a photo-quality printer, third place a digital camera and seven honourable mentions will each receive a photo software package. All winning entries will also receive official Saskatchewan Centennial merchandise and be placed on temporary display at the Saskatchewan legislative building. Major prizes are supplied by Microsoft Canada.

However, not just the top 10 photographs will be winners. All acceptable entries will become part of the Saskatchewan Government central Web portal.

They will be included in the picture rotation on the main page of the site and included in the online Saskatchewan Photo Album, with full accreditation to the photographer.

Submissions for the competition will only be accepted online on the Government of Saskatchewan central

Web portal. Images must be in a digital JPEG format and no larger than two megabytes. For full competition rules, information and submissions visit www.gov.sk.ca or call Art a 787-2215.

The competition begins on July 15th and runs until September 30th, 2005. The top 10 winning entries will be announced in October 2005.

In her studies, she analyses what the photographic market needs and where the opportunity lies for maximizing talent and style.

80% of photographers say that they do landscapes and nature.....so if there are all these great images out there of landscapes and nature, by lots of photographers.....(80%) think about how difficult it will be to break into the market. If on the other hand your passion to make images that fall into the other 20% of the market, opportunity for sales is much greater.

Here are some of the steps to finding your own style.

1. Attitude. If you believe that your work is really good, and you are on a path to learning, your attitude will sell your work.
2. Put your work out there. If you want people to like your work and buy your work, you have to dare to show it.

3. Photograph as much as you can. Dedicate a time of each week to do just photography. Hey, she says, golfers spend 5 hours just doing 18 holes. (Think what that would do to your photography!)

4. Pick those of your images that you think work and do more of the same.

5. Read, study, shoot and reshoot. Keep working at it.

6. Having a thematic obsession helps. (This I recognized from my own underwater flower obsession!)

7. Be consistent and reliable in your area.

Number 5 is Chantal's mantra. Her passion and obsession is night photography. She was just obsessed and driven enough to get herself locked into the Japanese Garden at the Devonian Botanic Gardens last year at night. From this she has some wonderful night images that reflect her dedication to her art.

In the meantime, check out your own obsession; shoot and reshoot!

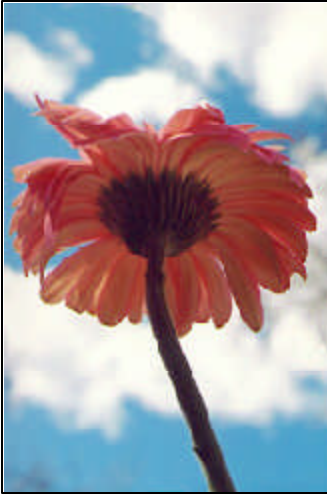
